### Major Changes

- Hizbullah forces (Non Governmental) now stocks some 50,000 rockets of all sizes. In particular – they received the M600 medium range ballistic missiles from Syria, as well as allegedly some Scud systems as well.
- No other major changes were recorded in the Lebanese order of battle.
