# Macron Steps into Middle East Role as U.S. Retreats

President Trump's decision to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of Israel, his anti-Muslim tweets and his State Department staffing cuts have signaled to many a retreat of American diplomacy. That has made room for those who want to expand their presence on the world stage, Mr. Macron among them. He has quickly embraced a more visible role in the Middle East, especially as Britain and Germany have become more deeply preoccupied with domestic politics. ## EU closes mammoth trade deal with Japan

The European Commission and Japan have finalized a bilateral free trade agreement. The deal will allow the bloc to sell food products including cheese, wines, and pork in Japan at reduced tariffs, granting Japanese carmakers easier access to the European market in exchange. Together, the EU and Japan account for about 30 percent of the world's gross domestic product. [*Politico*, December 8, 2017].
