Peace in the name of Allah: Egypt's quest to attain Islamic legitimacy for its treaty with Israel Ofir Winter

The year 2019 marked the 40th anniversary of Israel's peace agreement with Egypt. Although the agreement has not matured into a 'warm' peace between the two nations, it has survived challenges and vicissitudes to become a core component of strategic importance in the Middle East. This success is especially impressive given that until the peace treaty was signed – and, to a certain extent, even afterwards – the idea of peace with Israel was considered illegitimate in the prevailing discourse in Egypt and broader Arab and Muslim worlds. Since 1961, al-Azhar University in Cairo has served as an official organ of the Egyptian regime, and in March 1964, al-Azhar's Islamic Research Academy declared that one of its primary missions was to warn of the danger Israel posed to Islam and Muslims around the world.1 In March 1970, al-Azhar's Fatwa Committee determined that 'Muslims are prohibited from signing an agreement with Jews' and 'from allowing Jews to remain as a state in the heart of holy land of Muslim lands'.2 These are examples of obstacles – some of which were religious – the Egyptian regime had to confront as it asked its people to support the political pivot from conflict to peace with Israel, a country that, until then, was regarded in Egypt as a sworn enemy.
