



Emily B. Landau Annual Prize

for Research in Arms Control and Proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction

The Institute for National Security Studies (INSS) invites submission of research proposals on current topics pertaining to arms control and the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction (WMD) in the Middle East and worldwide, and their significance for Israel's national security.

Suggested research areas include, but are not limited to, proliferation of nonconventional weapons – nuclear, biological, and chemical – throughout the world; the Iranian nuclear crisis; nonconventional weapons in the Middle East; possibilities for a regional security dialogue in the Middle East; efforts by the United States and Europe to limit WMD proliferation; Israel's position on arms control efforts; the future of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT); non-state organizations and WMD proliferation.

Unpublished monographs and articles, in English and Hebrew, based on proposals approved by the prize committee, will be considered for the annual prize, which will be awarded at an event in memory of Dr. Emily B. Landau at the Institute for National Security Studies and published by INSS.

Research proposals should be submitted with a letter describing the proposed topic and include a well-defined research question, proposed methodology, projected insights and conclusions, and the implications for Israel. Completed monographs should be approximately 25,000 words and articles approximately 5,000 words, with documentation in APA format.

The research proposals and the completed research studies will be judged by the prize committee at INSS.

Research proposals for 2022-2023 should be submitted to the Emily B. Landau Prize Committee no later than April 30, 2023.
