Her most recent publications (co-editor) include *The Nuclear Nonproliferation Regime at a Crossroads* (2014); *Arms Control and National Security: New Horizons* (2014); and *The Interim Deal on the Iranian Nuclear Program: Toward a Comprehensive Solution?* (2014).

Anat Kurz, a senior research fellow, is director of research at the Institute for National Security Studies and editor of *INSS Insight*. She has lectured and published widely on insurgency-related issues, sub-state political organizations, and conflict resolution, and her current research focuses on the Palestinian national movement and Israeli-Palestinian relations. Among her publications are *Fatah and the Politics of Violence: The Institutionalization of a Popular Struggle* (2005) and *The Palestinian Uprisings: War with Israel War at Home* (2009), and she is co-editor of *Negotiating in Times of Conflict* (2015) and a contributing author to the volume.
